

LIST OF NAMES

The following are the names of people who make multiple appearances in the book. The numbers indicate the page where each is described for the first time. The names are organized alphabetically by first *or* last name, depending upon which I have used to identify the person in the text — a choice that reflects the context in which I knew the person.

In rural Latin America, it is customary to refer to people by their first names, adding the prefix *Don* or *Doña* to express deference. (So, for instance, César Sánchez might be known as Don César in the countryside and Señor Sánchez in Guatemala City.) The noms de guerre of guerrillas usually consist of a single name. In contexts where people are known by their last name, some choose to use their second (or matrilineal) last name in addition to their first.
