<i>Dongyi</i>	Eastern medicine (i.e., North Korean medicine)
<i>Gewei weisheng ju</i>	Revolutionary Committee Public Health Bureau

<i>Sanlao</i>	three olds (old physicians, old yaogong, old folk healers)
<i>Sexiangzi or Sexiang neiyi</i>	inner lining of a musk pouch
<i>Shan (or Zhong) caoyao</i>	Chinese herbs
<i>Shangpinhua</i>	to commercialize
<i>Shehui zhuyi nongye jihua</i>	socialist-based farming enterprise
<i>Shenjing fanshe xue</i>	neural reflex theory
<i>Shenjing xuwei zhushu liaofa</i>	nerve-acupuncture point-injection theory (a term of the 1950s)
<i>Shenjing zhushu liaofa</i>	nerve injection therapy
<i>Shenrong</i>	literally, deer antler and ginseng, but more generally high-end medicinals
<i>Shiliao</i>	food cures
<i>Shiyan or Shijian</i>	to experiment based on trial and error
<i>Shiyanchang zhan</i>	experimental farm stations
<i>Shizihao</i>	a registered product in the food category
<i>Tianjian shiyanshi</i>	laboratory in the field
<i>Tiaojishi</i>	druggists, but used interchangeably with yaogongshi during the Mao period
<i>Tufa</i>	indigenous methods
<i>Tuyao</i>	folk medicinals
<i>Tu zhuanjia</i>	indigenous experts
<i>Weisheng</i>	hygiene
<i>Weisheng fangyi zhan</i>	sanitary (or hygiene) and epidemic prevention stations
<i>Weisheng yuan</i>	hygiene institute
<i>Xiandaihua</i>	to modernize
<i>Xiangzhen qiye</i>	township enterprise
<i>Xinghuo jihua</i>	China Spark Program
<i>Xin sheng shiwu</i>	new matters
<i>Xin yao</i>	new drugs
<i>Xin yi</i>	new medicine
<i>Xiyihua</i>	to westernize
<i>Xuerong</i>	blood antlers

<i>Xuwei zhushe liaofa</i>	acupuncture point-injection therapy (used in present-day China)
<i>Yanfang</i>	prescriptions based on experience rather than science
<i>Yaocai shougou zhan</i>	herb collection stations
<i>Yaogongshi</i>	medicine shop workers, but referred to Western-trained pharmacologists and pharmacists during the Mao period
<i>Yaojian zihao</i>	a registered product in the drug category
<i>Yaojiu</i>	medicinal wine
<i>Yiliao zhan</i>	medical stations
<i>Yishi</i>	physicians
<i>Yiyao gongsi</i>	state-owned Chinese drug companies
<i>Yizhu</i>	medical assistants
<i>Yuanliao yaocai</i>	crude drugs
<i>Yufang</i>	to prevent (or defend)
<i>Yumin yisheng</i>	fishermen doctors
<i>Zangqi shenghua yaowu</i>	organo-biochemical drugs
