

# AAID Annual Educational Conference: "A Time to Enjoy"

**T**he American Academy of Implant Dentistry (AAID) Annual Educational Conference will take place October 26–29, 2016 at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in New Orleans. Over 1000 implant dentistry professionals will gather, not only to expand their knowledge base in our fast-changing profession, but also to exchange ideas and experiences, and participate in supportive fellowship with colleagues from around the world.

Vendors representing dental implant related products and professional services will be in attendance. These vendors not only meet the daily needs of the implant practice, but also help make this annual educational meeting possible.

The program has built-in opportunities for first-time attendees and returning members to interact on the clinical, business, and political issues that our profession faces.
