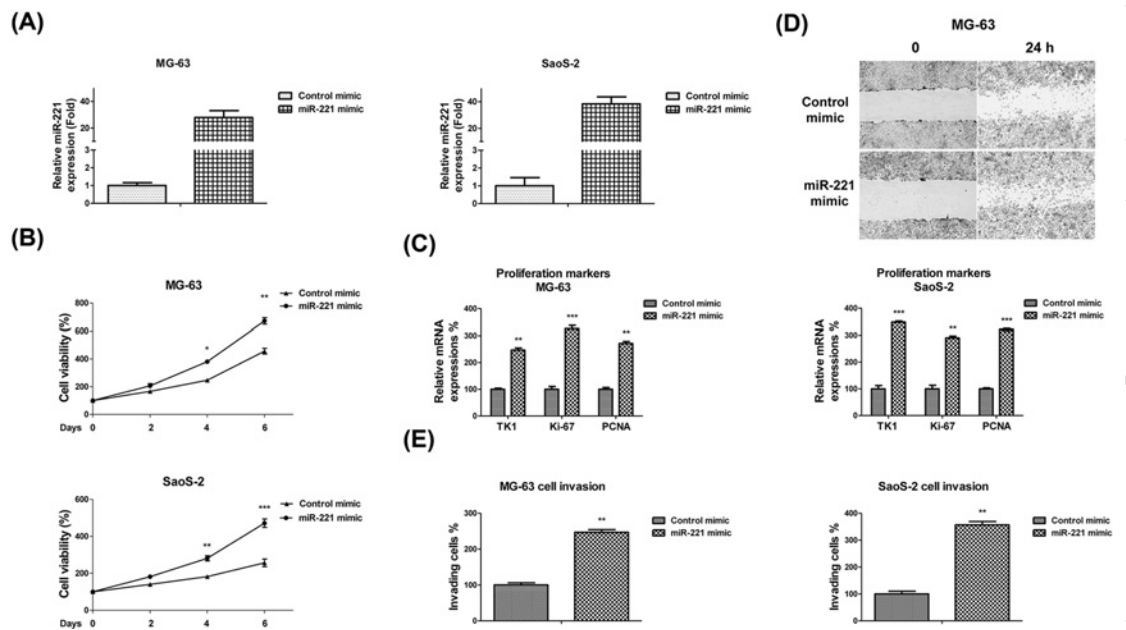

**Figure 2. miR-221 overexpression promotes OS cell proliferation, migration, and invasion**  
**(A)** miR-221 or control mimics were transfected into MG-63 (left) and SaoS-2 (right) cells at 50 nM concentrations for 48 h. miR-221 expressions were analyzed using qRT-PCR and normalized to RNU6. **(B)** MG-63 (upper) and SaoS-2 (lower) cells were transfected with 50 nM of control or miR-221 mimics for 48 h, followed by the measurements of cell proliferation via MTT assay and **(C)** measurements of the cell proliferation markers, TK1, Ki-67, and PCNA, using qRT-PCR. **(D)** MG-63 cells were transfected with 50 nM of control or miR-221 mimics for 48 h. Cell migration was measured via wound healing assay and **(E)** cell invasion was measured via transwell assay. Data are presented as mean ± SD. Columns, mean of three independent experiments; bars, SD; \*,  $P < 0.05$ ; \*\*,  $P < 0.01$ ; \*\*\*,  $P < 0.001$ .
