### CLINICAL CYTOPATHOLOGY FOR PATHOLOGISTS

### IAEA SYMPOSIUM ON MEDICAL RADIOISOTOPE SCINTIGRAPHY

The fourth symposium organized by the International Atomic Energy Agency in the field of Medical Radioisotope Scintigraphy will be held on October 23–28, 1972, in Monaco. The symposium will cover all aspects of the scintigraphic technique and its applications but will give particular attention to new advances in the technique.

Abstracts of such papers must be submitted through these authorities so as to reach the International Atomic Energy Agency before May 26, 1972.

### ANNUAL MEETING OF THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF CONTEMPORARY MEDICINE AND SURGERY

The annual meeting of the American Society of Contemporary Medicine and Surgery (formerly Society of Cryosurgery) will be held February 28 to March 2, 1972, at the Diplomat Hotel, Hollywood, Florida. Cancer will be the main subject of this four-day meeting with delivery of the opening lecture of the Elmer Holmes Bobst lecture series on cancer by Dr. George Moore of Roswell Park Memorial Institute. The program will include symposia and discussions on laser surgery, cryosurgery for cancer, treatment of giant cell tumors of the bone, and other subjects of interest.
