### **INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON INORGANIC AND NUTRITIONAL ASPECTS OF CANCER**

The International Conference on Inorganic and Nutritional Aspects of Cancer will be held from January 2 to 5, 1977, at the La Jolla Village Inn, La Jolla, California. The conference is organized by the International Association of Bioinorganic Scientists and is sponsored by the National Cancer Institute and the University of California at San Diego.

### **FIRST INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS ON TOXICOLOGY**

The First International Congress on Toxicology will be held at the Royal York Hotel in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, from March 30 to April 2, 1977. Anyone interested may attend. The preliminary list of topics includes: Status and Problems in Toxicology (Food; Drugs; Air and Water; Occupation); Interspecies High-Dose Low-Dose Extrapolations (Rationale for High Dose Exposures; Human Correlations, Animal Dose Response; Consideration of Experimental Thresholds: Acute Actions and Mechanisms, Chronic Actions and Mechanisms, The Low Incidence Response); Linking Experimental Toxicology and Epidemiology (Drugs: Contraceptive Hormones, Neurotoxicities, Antiepileptics, Tricyclic Anti-Depressants; Environment: Industrial Exposures, Industrial Carcinogens, Food); Toxicology in Transition (Scientific Influences; Regulatory and Public Influences; Impact on Drugs, Foods, Environment).

Papers for this meeting may be submitted by members of any recognized society or

association of toxicology. Persons not members of such societies may present papers at this meeting if they are sponsored by a member of a recognized group. Abstracts should be submitted to the secretary no later than October 1, 1976.

The following change should be made in the article, entitled "Electron Microscopic Study of Virus Particles in Yolk Sac and Placenta and in Hematopoietic Organs of Newborn C3Hf Mice," by Dorothy Feldman, Ludwik Gross, and Richard L.
