TRAVEL AWARDS FROM THE COMPREHENSIVE MINORITY BIOMEDICAL PROGRAM OF THE NATIONAL CANCER INSTITUTE

Once again funds will be available to help a limited number of minority scientists to attend the AACR and ASCO Annual Meetings. The National Cancer Institute is funding this program in order to encourage participation in the annual meetings by predoctoral students and postdoctoral fellows from minority groups which have traditionally been underrepresented in cancer research. Eligible scientists are those who either are engaged in cancer research or have training that could lead to contributions in this field. By action of the AACR Board of Directors, only citizens or permanent residents of the United States and Canada may receive one of the National Cancer Institute awards.

Awardees will be selected by an advisory committee based on a completed application and letters of reference. The committee will consist of members of both AACR and ASCO. The maximum award available will be \$300 plus economy air or land transportation to and from the meeting. Applicants will be chosen from minority institutions and the larger bodies of universities and research institutions. Although preference will be shown to those who are authors of abstracts accepted for presentation at the annual meetings, this is not a requirement. Applications will be accepted until March 1, 1987. Awardees are expected to attend at least three full days of scientific sessions. They are also expected to submit a brief report after the meeting commenting on the sessions they attended.
