

Correction Notice

In “The Professionalization of Academic Advising: A Structured Literature Review”, published in the *NACADA Journal*, 39(1), there was an error in reporting the data collection processes. The sentence in question (on page 91) reads, “The related terms *profession*, *professionalism*, and *profession* (which captures every permutation of the key term) were tested but produced irrelevant results.” The second instance of “profession” should have an asterisk attached to it (*profession**). The asterisk at the end of a keyword in a search is called an asterisk wildcard. The root word is searched with different word endings; in this case, the root word is profession. Thus, the sentence should read, “The related terms *profession*, *professionalism*, and *profession** (which captures every permutation of the key term) were tested but produced irrelevant results.”
