

Seventeenth Annual Thomas Robbins Award

For Excellence in the Study
of New Religious Movements

The co-general editors of *Nova Religio* are pleased to announce the winners of the Seventeenth Annual Thomas Robbins Award for Excellence in the Study of New Religious Movements. The award was established in 2002 by the late Thomas Robbins to recognize outstanding articles published in *Nova Religio*.

Prizewinners were selected by board members of the Association for the Academic Study of New Religions from articles appearing in volume 23 of the journal.

The first prize has been awarded to Damon T. Berry for his article in vol. 23, no. 4 (May 2020), “Voting in the Kingdom: Prophecy Voters, the New Apostolic Reformation, and Christian Support for Trump.” Berry receives a one-year complimentary subscriptions to *Nova Religio*.

The second prize has been awarded to Amy Hart for her article in vol. 23 no. 2 (November 2019), “‘All is Harmony in that Department’: Religious Expressions within the Fourierist Communal Experiments of the 1840s.” She will also receive a one-year complimentary subscription to *Nova Religio*.

We appreciate the generosity of the late Thomas Robbins in providing the opportunity to acknowledge *Nova Religio*’s authors in this tangible way. We look forward to recognizing outstanding contributors to volume 24 next year.
